Starting in 1997 with the establishment of a gallery for a group of artists, her artistic career has spanned a number of countries including the United Kingdom and roles as an artist and curator. She has lived in New Zealand since 2018. In 2019, the first one person exhibition of her work was held in Yekaterinburg, Russia. During the past few years she has exhibited the length of New Zealand, starting in the Far North with exhibitions in Whangarei, Kawakawa, Opononi and Auckland, before moving to South Canterbury in 2021. She now lives in Timaru.

Since holding the solo exhibition 'Sketches' at the Waimate Art Gallery in 2022, Nadia Curnow has gained a high regional profile with her group exhibitions including the Edinburgh Premier Art Awards, Dunedin (2023) and the exhibition 'Domestic Bliss' (2024) at the Aigantighe Art Gallery, Timaru.
